MCC → UNMC

The Nursing program is a bachelor's degree program at UNMC. Listed below are Metropolitan Community College courses that satisfy the University of Nebraska Center's (UNMC) Nursing program admission requirements. UNMC has a minimum requirement of 93 quarter hours (92 semester hours) of non-nursing courses for students intending to pursue a baccalaureate nursing degree from the UNMC College of Nursing. Contact a UNMC Advisor regarding application to the Nursing program. **Students should consult with their MCC Advisor and an UNMC advisor often.**

Since admission is based on GPA, completion of all the required courses does not guarantee admission to the UNMC College of Nursing.

NOTES

- The UNMC College of Nursing admits 75 students into Omaha, 72 students into Lincoln, 48 students into Kearney and Norfolk, and 36 students into West Nebraska divisions in the fall of each year. Admission into the College of Nursing is very competitive. The following are considered for admission:
 - A minimum total GPA of 2.5 is required. Admission preference is given to students with GPAs of 3.0 and above.
 - It is recommended that students complete most of the above listed requirements prior to applying. **MCC offers an Associate of Science in Pre-Nursing degree that will satisfy all of UNMC's admission requirements.** Please see the UNMC Pre-Nursing guide for more details.
- It is recommended that students complete the courses listed above within two years, and no more than five years. Courses transferred after five years will be reviewed individually.
- Completed application deadline is February 1 for fall admission.

Every effort has been made to provide accurate information on suggested courses, however it is the student's responsibility to consult with the institution they are planning to transfer to ensure courses fit into their intended plan of study.
