

Reinstatement to F-1 Status

Neither Metropolitan Community College nor International Student Services (ISS) can provide legal advice. Whatever course of action you choose to pursue you are strongly encouraged to consult with a qualified immigration lawyer. Not all lawyers specialize in immigration law, thus, finding a qualified immigration lawyer is important. One resource available for finding a qualified immigration lawyer includes American Immigration Lawyers Association: Immigration Lawyer Search www.ailalawyer.com. Under "Type of Lawyer", select "Students and Exchange Visitors". Then type in your zip code and hit "Search".

Step 1: Do you qualify for reinstatement?

In order to apply for reinstatement to F-1 status, the following conditions must be met:

- 1. Your being out of status must result from circumstances beyond your control or failure to receive reinstatement will result in extreme hardship to you
- 2. You are currently pursuing or intending to pursue a full course of study at MCC
- 3. You have not been in violation of your status for more than 5 months, unless you have a strong reason
- 4. You have NOT engaged in unauthorized employment
- 5. You are not deportable on any other grounds

Step 2: Gather the following documents:

- 1. Obtain a check or money payable to U.S. Dept. of Homeland Security. The amount is based on what USCIS is currently charging. The fee does change. Please go to https://www.uscis.gov/i-539. Scroll down to Form Details and click on Filing Fee. It tells you the filing fee and if a biometrics fee is required. There is a Fee Calculator available.
- 2. Complete Form I-539 in **black ink**. The form and directions are available at: https://www.uscis.gov/i-539. Scroll down to "Forms and Document Downloads".
- 3. If you have <u>dependents</u>, include \$85 for biometrics and complete Form I-539A in <u>black ink</u> for <u>each</u> dependent. The form directions are available at: https://www.uscis.gov/i-539. Scroll down to "Forms and Document Downloads".
- 4. Optional: If you would like USCIS to email or text you when your application is received, please complete the G-1145 form listed at: https://www.uscis.gov/i-539. Scroll down to "Forms and Document Downloads".
- 5. A letter from you addressed to the U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services explaining the circumstances surrounding your failure to maintain legal status. The letter should contain the following:
 - Your name, address, telephone number, and date
 - Information about why you need to reinstate your F-1 status and the reason for status violation
 - A statement that you are pursuing or intend to pursue a full course of study at MCC
 - A statement that you have not engaged in unauthorized employment and that you are not deportable on any ground other than failing to maintain your status
 - A sentence to indicate that failure to receive reinstatement to lawful F-1 status would result in extreme hardship
- Financial documentation not more than 6 months old, in English, and in U.S. currency. Provide either an <u>original</u> bank statement or letter. Bank statements printed from the Internet are not original.

- 8. Original transcripts from all college and universities attended in the U.S.
 9. One copy of all pages of previously issued I-20s. Please do not staple them.
- 10. One copy of passport pages (identity, visa and passport expiration pages)
- 11. Copy of electronic I-94 available at https://i94.cbp.dhs.gov
- 12. If you have been out of status for more than 5 months, include a receipt of \$350 SEVIS Fee payment. More information on paying the fee is available online at www.fmjfee.com.

Step 3: Request a "Reinstatement Requested I-20" from ISS
